





## What Is H.E.L.P. (4357)?

**H.E.L.P.** (selcall 4357) is Austravel Safety Net's simple, safe and sure pathway to attaining help and assistance in remote areas of Australia using a HF radio when no other means of emergency communication is available.

Austravels' H.E.L.P. (4357) system is designed specifically for experienced and inexperienced HF radio users alike; delivering a "no fuss" method of attaining help in remote areas of Australia, whilst at the same time understanding the nuances of the HF radio signal.

Underpinned by Austravels' new Telcall+ technology platform (see separate info leaflet) Telcall+ equipped and re-profiled HF radios unlock the true potential of the Austravel HF radio network and its range of innovative HF radio services - raising the level of emergency call responsiveness and assurance in times of need.

All H.E.L.P. calls are free to all Austravel members and is covered within the annual membership fee structure....however, Telcall+ subscription is a suggested addition that enhances the H.E.L.P. System.

Depending on the HF radios make and model, a successful H.E.L.P. (4357) Selcall or "Send GPS Position" call from your HF radio, triggers the new automated system into action, by sending an "emergency response required" SMS to several Austravel base operators at one time.

## H.E.L.P. (4357) Terms & Conditions

Austravel Safety Net's **H.E.L.P**. (selcall 4357) system is a simplified HF radio emergency call facility available to Austravel financial members. Simplified due to the need to remember **only one** emergency selcall number (4357) for all Austravel bases.

There are two (2) types of H.E.L.P. calls:-

Medical Emergency calls - A medical emergency is an acute injury or illness that poses an immediate risk to a person's life or long-term health.

Assistance Calls - roadside assist, vehicle recovery, road weather alerts, Police, Rural Fire, SES, Border Security etc.

When an Austravel member requests particular information (i.e. weather alerts / road closures etc.) the information attained by the Austravel H.E.L.P. Emergency Respondent maybe sourced from various informative internet sites.

Austravel Safety Net Inc. does not generate the information in its own right, therefore cannot guarantee any particular level of reliability for the information we ultimately relay to any Austravel member requesting said information.

The information is gained from the best sources we can access, with the Austravel travelling member in the field making their own decisions based on the information provided at that time.

Austravel H.E.L.P. Emergency Respondents, as volunteers, will use either what they know or use various information systems (typically the internet) as best available knowledge at that time. Austravel H.E.L.P. (4357) operators are only disseminating information, not providing advice.

While the various statutory authorities and local business people can be a valuable source of remote area travel information, we recommend local police as possibly the best starting point for your "non medical" emergency enquiries.
