RFDS IN ACTION (submitted by Peter and Carol Illmayer 9599)

Not sure where to share this kind of information however its all food for thought. Some Austravel members are aware (my wife) Carol works as a flight nurse for the RFDS out of Alice Springs. She was activated 2 nights ago to attend a motorcycle accident out on the Plenty Highway literally in the middle of no where.

The motorcyclist appears to have separated from the bike at speed on a corrugated / bulldust section of the Plenty Hwy.

It appears passers-by found the injured rider on the side of the road. They were carrying a PLB which they activated. I didn't get the full story on how the PLB (Personal Location Beacon) activation translated to an RFDS activation however it did.

The RFDS had to land on a Station runway and then drive 50km in a Landcruiser ute to the accident site. A number of nomad couples stopped and assisted the RFDS with the recovery, picking up medical waste and simply lighting up the site with torches while Carol and the doctor worked on the motorcyclist on the side of the road in heavy bulldust.

Carol has previously been involved in recovery of people that were carrying PLBs, they work and work very well.

While we all have HF sets in the car, if you experience a roll over and rip the antenna off, not many people have the ability to recover from it either technically or they may be in no state to effect any sort of repair.

From everything I've seen and heard about emergency recovery, some sort of PLB is just a must no matter what else you carry. \$279 PLB is simply a "no brainer"

if you are going remote.

Setting one of these things off will bring help, if Carol has to come and get you then you've definitely got a visit to hospital ahead.

Just thought I'd share this as it is real, people do suffer accidents and the cost of these devices is nothing when compared to your life !!! Cheer - Pete in Alice (9599)

Presidents report for August 2018

The Network continues to expand and develop with the recent installation of a new Base in Kununurra . Some frequency changes and updates to channels were necessary to accommodate the new base channels.

Channels 1 and 4 frequencies were moved to clear other commercial & defence channels in accordance with ACMA licensing requirements. Channel 6 is a new frequency to replace the old frequency which suffered from extreme interference (QRM) from our northern neighbours.

Unfortunately, several of our channels suffer similar QRM at various times of day and season which we are unable to resolve. The only possible resolution to the QRM problem is to increase transmit power or to go to digital mode/format, neither of which is feasible at present.

The Kununurra Base (6299) was established to overcome some of these QRM issues and to provide radio coverage to the north west WA & NT. It is operating exceptionally well with signal reports from many locations, however there are very few callers in both the am or pm scheds presently. Kununurra is being operated as part of the Western Australian Sched 15 minutes ahead of the Perth morning and afternoon scheduled operating times.

One morning or afternoon, when you have a few spare minutes, check your schedule time sheet and call in to 6299, your call and signal report is welcomed and valued.

On to other matters - the 2018 AGM is at Kellerberrin Raceway this year August 25th at 1 pm. There will be a 'skype' tele-conference hook-up to Casino for members to participate. There are other talks planned and the dinner will be on Saturday night. Please RSVP.

Barrett communications will also be demonstrating their latest HF DSP transceiver the 4050 and autotune/GPS antenna on Sunday morning. If you are attending the dinner please contact me on 0427 000 995 or the Vice-president Tom 2714 on 0408 928 279.

I will be stepping down as President this year. I believe that the Club & Network are both going well and it is time to hand over the reins to someone younger, fitter and better looking!! Any takers?? Well 2 out of 3 is not bad....

Did You Know?

In relation to making HF radio interconnect telephone calls....did you know?

- To make a HF radio telephone interconnect call you need to be a Telcall+ subscriber
- You can call any landline or mobile phone in Australia
- You call is timed to six (6) minutes duration (then the call is automatically cut off), but you can make as many 6 minute calls as you like
- "Fair use policy" on the number of phone calls made in one month is the only restriction
- You should avoid trying to call 1800 and 1300 numbers as these phone lines are typically answered by "robots"
 - i.e. robot answers you call then instructs you to dial 1 for this and 2 for that
 - the HF radio telephone system does not support DTMF tone calling once the call is answered
 - Extending beyond the phone call being answered; your telephone interconnect call is limited to voice operation only
 - Always include the STD code in your landline phone number
 - Practice making interconnect telephone calls before leaving on a trip, allow family and friends the opportunity to hear what a HF interconnect phone call sounds like



Change 1:-

During my resent trip to install Kununurra base I used the Telcall system extensively while driving home. I discovered a problem when hanging up a phone call from the radio in that the NGT radio goes directly back into scan.

If there were any messages ready to forward to you they would immediately start coming, but the radio is now on scan. Messages have a short lead in that is not supportive of scan so in this instance a message was lost. I have had some other times when logging a GPS position and I am in a noisy area. I can send a GPS position OK but not in a good place for receive, subsequently I lost a message after a GPS request.

To overcome these issues I have had the Telcall system modified such that you now get your messages after <u>you send a selcall only to a base.</u> You do your normal beacon channel test calls to any base and when you have decided on a suitable channel send a selcall on that channel to get your messages.

The messages will then be sent one after the other. Listen for all messages to be complete before putting your radio back on scan.

Change 2:

System message <TIME PLEASE> to a base now returns UTC time instead of WST. It is up to the users to work out the time at their present location from the reply. For example WST add 8 hours for EST add 10 hours and you can work out the time in the middle. I believe this is more universal for a time standard. You can be anywhere in Australia using a base on the other side of Australia so it is not possible to return the time for where you are located. UTC is the standard used by aviation etc. for wide area coverage.

JUST A REMINDER......there are two similar (but different) text messaging systems within the Telcall+ platform



1 SMS

This facility allows Telcall+ subscribers to send a short, (up to) 64 character message form their capable HF radio to any mobile phone in Australia. (operates one way only i.e. from HF radio to mobile phone)

2 MAII BOX

Mail Box messaging is quite different to the SMS messaging because Mail Box has two elements and is bidirectional. The most notable difference is that Mail box messages are **sent and stored before delivery**

- Mail Box messages can be sent :-
 - from a members HF radio to another members HF radio
 - from family and friends via the Out-n-About app to a HF radio
 - all "Mail Box" messages are sent and stored in the "cloud" first
 - then delivered when the Austravel intended member selcalls a base
 - Telcall+ subscription necessary
 - HF radios must be message/page call capable

MAII BOX

NOTE: For PLB's to be effective they must be registered with the Australian Maritime Safety Authority in Canberra.

Registration is free and provides relevant information for the rescue authorities about the PLB user and his/her contact's.

Austravel members can also list Austravel's contact details using the central Austravel office phone contact system of (07) 2101 3456.

Listing Austravel as an "in case of emergency" contact as well as family or friends, provides AMSA with additional methods of identifying the PLB user and how they can validate/ assess the emergency situation.







PLB

Australian Maritime Safety Authority (AMSA) suggesttwo-way communications via a mobile/satellite phone or radio (a HF radio, fitted with a GPS receiver in the case of Austravel members) is the most effective means of communication when in a distress situation, with some of the reasons outlined below:

- 1. Instant confirmation that the call has been received by emergency services;
- 2. Ability to communicate position, nature of distress, required assistance;
- Emergency services can adequately scale response assets according to required assistance;
- 4. Ability to provide updates on the situation and also receive advice until emergency services arrive.

If two-way communications are not available, then a distress beacon should be activated in situations of grave and imminent danger. This equates to when you feel you are facing a life threatening situation. This is a personal decision that is different for everybody.

The correct way to deploy your beacon depends on the type of beacon you have and whether you're on land or water.

THERE ARE THREE (3) TYPES OF EMERGENCY BEACONS IN USE

1. Emergency Locator Transmitter (ELT)

Usage: AIRCRAFT

The ELT is a detection and location device used in general aviation in the case of an aircraft crash which is vitally important to the search and rescue (SAR) teams and to potential survivors.

2. Emergency Position Indicating Radio Beacon (EPIRB)

Usage: Maritime, Land, Air

In most states of Australia, EPIRBs are required for boats that travel more than 2 nautical miles from the coast. EPIRBs may also be used on land or carried in place of an ELT.

3. Personal Locator Beacon (PLB)

Usage: Land, Marine, Air

PLBs are smaller and easier to transport than other beacons, and are designed to be worn or carried by individuals rather than vehi cles. In some cases, PLB's do not meet carriage requirements for maritime vessels travelling more than 2 nautical miles from the coast. For aircraft, PLB's may be carried in place of an ELT.

4. Personal Locator Beacon (PLB Costs)

Depending on brand /specification between \$200 > \$300 AMSA registration is vitally important and is free

AMSA suggest that buyers should look for products that meet Australian Standards. Beacons manufactured for the Australian market have GPS included. Its important to check before you buy overseas, that your proposed purchase of a PLB meets Australian standards and is GPS capable. AMSA does not endorse any particular brand or model of distress beacon.

SCHEDULED NET (SCHED) INFORMATION UPDATE

Whether we spell "Scheds" or "Skeds" correctly, doesn't matter, what matters is keeping up-to-date with the changes to the Austravel sched sessions, because the club is growing in the number of bases and membership. You will find with the delivery of this edition (and all editions) of the Channel Chatter newsletter, will be:-

- an up-to-date member selcall list
- an up-to-date base/channel list (remember not all channels are used in all base)
- an up-to-date east and west sched timetable.

This documentation is designed to be printed and carried in your vehicle that has the HF radio fitted. It's important to keep this updated information handy. Its also important do dump the old versions.....to save confusion down the track!

Now that you know when and where scheds are operated from, the writer (0951) who also is an Austravel sched operator, has a favour to ask.....when you voice call into a sched its important to understand that you may hear the base (if a base is used in the sched), better than the base can hear you.

By virtue of the base having a better antenna system, radio voltage, etc, than a typical mobile station, its often the case that the mobile station hears the base well, but the base operator can't hear the mobile station clearly. Please get into the habit of announcing your selcall number more than once.....e.g. Casino base this is 0951, 0951, 0951 can

Remember, the base sched operator(s) have an automatic vox microphone and your first utterance's may not be recognised in the beginning, so repeating your selcall number more than once is an important thing to remember. Also slow down your speech and raise you voice (do not shout) when transmitting.



Keep your sched information up-to-date.

Assist sched operators by first announcing your selcall number three times...Casino base this is 0951, 0951, 0951 can you read me?

Kununurra Base may reply with a different sound to other bases sometimes.

After a beacon (test call) or other action call you may hear a constant tone for a few seconds. Just like a Barrett radio tuning up. If the base has been on antenna two the first time it is secalled/beaconed etc. it does an an-

tenna tune instead of the normal (doe, ray, me) revertive tone.

This is normal and means you got through OK even if you only hear the tuning tone. It happens because we have two antennas on Kununurra base and antenna number 2 needs to be set up in the base radio for an auto tuner. When the radio goes back to normal scan, which it does on antenna number 1 - which does not need tuning - it tries to tune anyway.


Hence the tone.

When you do here the (doe, ray, me) revertive, it is a bit shorter than other bases. This is the same reason as above. The radio does a quick check of the antenna tuning and it misses the first part of the revertive. It does sound a little different to other bases as the other bases do not have a second antenna that sometimes needs to be tuned.




